26-27/031 To receive Apologies:

26-27/034 To review and resolve any East Riding of Yorkshire (ERYC) Council business.

34.1/2/3 The Ward Councillor, Mr Jeremy Wilcock, attended the meeting.

Clean Air Solar Farm (CASF)

ERYC Full Council opposes the construction of the Clean Air Solar Farm and all local Solar Farms that use good agricultural land. The Council is not against Solar Farms in general but believes they should not be built on good agricultural land.

The Clean Air Action Group has sent a detailed response to the Scoping Report.

Dogger Bank SD (DBD)

Public consultation is ongoing until 3rd August 2026. Presentations are at the Treasure House, Beverley, and at the library in Cottingham.

26-27/035 Parish Council ongoing Business Matters:

To review, debate, and agree on an action plan for each of the following items;

- 35.1 Clean Air Solar Farm (CASF) – Parish Councillor Ian Jowett delivered a detailed presentation on the project's status and the proposed cable route.
- 35.2 Dogger Bank D (DBD) – Parish Councillor Ian Jowett gave a detailed presentation on the project's status and the proposed cable route. The cable route plan was still under development, with further detail expected in 2027.

The PC and Parishioners thanked Parish Councillor Ian Jowett for the effort he had put into the presentations.

- 35.3 Parish Council Co-option – The Chairman welcomed our newly co-opted Parish Councillor, Jo Moxon, and thanked her for her interest and support in helping the Parish.
- 35.4 (a) Village Green Beck Side Hedge Forward plan (between the Village Green and Front Street). There were two proposals put before the PC.

Option 1 – Remove the overgrown hedge, replace the fencing, and plant a new hedge with a few specimen trees.

Option 2 – Cut back the current hedge to 1.2m (including overgrown hazel), leaving the large specimen trees in place.

A detailed discussion took place on the pros and cons of both options, including safety, costs, asset protection and biodiversity. It was stated that healthy, well-managed hedgerows serve as good nesting sites and provide protection for small birds.

The PC had received several quotes to carry out this work and agreed to go with the £100 + VAT quote.

Following this discussion, Parish Councillor Alistair Grant proposed that we select **Option 2**; this was seconded by Parish Councillor Ian Jowett.

A vote was taken, and the resolution was passed unanimously.

Clerk to liaise with the contractor and arrange a date – action ongoing.

26-27/035 Parish Council ongoing Business Matters continued:

35.4 (b) Hardstanding & Hedge replacement (Between VG and Thorpe)

- (i) Remove the current hedge, replace the fencing, and subsequently replant with whips (as per planning approval). The PC had received and reviewed several quotes. Parish Councillor Ian Jowett proposed that we accept the £1050 + VAT quote; this was seconded by Parish Councillor Alistair Grant.

A vote was taken, and the resolution was carried unanimously.

- (ii) Hardstanding price increase – As planning for this has taken so long, the price has increased by £600. This is in addition to the 5% donation the PC must fund.

A discussion ensued about how we could reduce the project's scope to offset the additional £600 cost. The Clerk explained that if we were to consider this, it would mean going back to ERYC Planning and Grant section to see whether, and if so what, we needed to be amended.

- (iii) ERYC Grant Extension - The Clerk explained that we have until 31.1.27 to complete the hardstanding project; otherwise, we would lose the grant money. This should also inform the decision in (ii) above. Completion means all work has been undertaken and paid for, and the necessary survey of residents has been completed and returned to ERYC.

Clerk to liaise with Planning and DIYFEY to clarify position.

35.5 Ongoing request for future maintenance assistance for the village green.
Not debated at this meeting due to time constraints.

d) Children's Play Area update.

- (i) Decision on Scope.
- (ii) Planning requirement/approval.
- (iii) Ongoing inspection and maintenance.

Not discussed in detail at this meeting due to time constraints. It was decided to hold an Extraordinary Meeting to discuss this item and give it the time and thought required (date to be decided).

2059 hrs – the clerk asked if the meeting wanted to suspend the Standing Order 3 x (2-hour maximum meeting). It was agreed that the SO would be extended for 30 minutes.

35.6 Green Lane Aike – The Clerk had received feedback from ERYC that the land known as Green Lane was privately owned – no further action.

- 35.7 Proposal - Summer Soirée on the Village Green (Joint function between LPC & VH);
Suggested date: Saturday, 22nd August at 4 pm. This was briefly discussed; however, the Village Hall Committee were holding a meeting later in the week, so it was decided to hold off until after the meeting. There was also a concern about whether the VH alcohol licence permits them to sell alcohol outside the VH's boundaries.
- 35.8 Asset Audit - The Clerk asked the meeting for volunteers to carry out the 2026 asset audit. Parish Councillors Helen Miller and Rob Ellet volunteered to undertake this task.
- 35.9 Dredging of Bryan Mills Beck.

Discussion took place on the timing and frequency of Beck dredging. The Clerk explained that in 2021 the EA had agreed to clean the Beck three times a year, though it was unclear whether this is still the case. The discussion then moved to the best time to clean the Beck to mitigate flooding, and how the EA ensure that their practices do not unduly affect the Beck's biodiversity.

Clerk to discuss with the EA – Action complete.
